A place to enjoy crown green bowls, meet & make friends



Q: Where is the Club?

A: Heversham Bowling Club is located just below the Athenaeum in Leasgill and was formed in 2001.

Q: Is Crown green bowls hard to learn?

A: No the basic rules are simple to learn and it can be played by people of all ages.

Q: How can I start to play?

A: We run a free come and try day at the start of every season. Alternatively you can come and try on your own (still free) with the help of a member. Contact the club secretary Tom Grindey: 07907286836 email: <u>hevershambowler@gmail.com</u> An aim of the clubs sport development plan is to encourage people to take up the game.

Q: Will I need special equipment or clothing?

A: Only flat shoes, with no heel to protect the green. Most players like to have their own bowls eventually but the club has bowls of all sizes which players can use. We often have some bowls for sale.

Q: Is crown green bowls a very competitive sport?

A: Its upto you. We aim to strike a balance between competitive and social play. There are social sessions on Wednesday and Sunday afternoons. We normally draw for partners. Domestic competitions are held at least once a month throughout the season. There are friendly matches against other clubs and we encourage members new to bowling to play in these. Members also arrange to play at other times when no organised sessions are in play. Q: What about playing in leagues?

A: The club has 5 teams playing across South Lakeland. There are 2 teams in the South Westmorland seniors (over 60's) league, 2 teams in the Kendal and district league and a team in the South Lakeland rural league (for players new to the game) It is club policy that members could expect to play in a lower team in their 1st season.

Q: How much does it cost?

A: Membership is £42 a season (£5 for juniors under 18) To play in a league team or open competitions a player has to be registered with the British Crown Green Bowling Association (BCGBA). The current registration fee is £12 for life.

Clubhouse keys are available for £3 returnable deposit. These give access to bowls, refreshment facilities and toilets.

Q: If I don't join can I still use the green?

A: Yes green fees (payable in an honesty box) are £2 a session or £1 if you play with a member.

Q: When is the green open?

A: We open the green at the end of March and close late September/early October.
